TRASH TALK: We're on a mission to keep our community sparkling clean, along with protecting private property. Give those garbage totes some space - 3 feet, please! Bagging your trash and closing the lid will also ensure loose debris doesn't blow out on a windy day while being collected. Heaviest items on bottom is best. If you have extra trash, please stop at the city hall for a \$3 extra bag sticker for bags up to 30 gallons.

Hazardous items such as TV's, chemicals, microwaves, paint or florescent bulbs must be taken to the City of Fargo's Household Hazardous Waste facility.

Quick reminder: General trash doesn't belong at the City Recycling Center. If you're not sure, throw it in the garbage. The Recycling Center is sorted by hand, so let's give our sanitation crew a hand ensuring recycling is done correctly.

Reminders & FYI's for Residents & Guests

Off-Highway Vehicles

Off-Highway Vehicles (OHVs) are motor-driven recreational vehicles for off-road use only, not for highways. Examples include ATVs, UTVs, go-karts, mopeds, and scooters. They're not allowed on city streets unless meeting State rules:

- Register with NDDOT and display the decal.
- A licensed driver over 16.
- Street legal: headlamp, horn, taillamp, mirror, speedometer, brake light, odometer, motor over 350cc.
- Under 18 must wear a safety helmet.
 Driving off-road vehicles in city areas like sidewalks, dikes, parks, golf courses, or boulevards is illegal.

Storm Drains

Grass clippings, leaves, fertilizer, and pet waste from your yard often end up on the street. When it rains, these things get washed into storm drains, which then get clogged. This stops them from working properly and causes flooding.

Storm drains lead directly to streams, rivers, and ponds. If debris isn't removed, it can make these water bodies more polluted.

One more thing to know: wet grass clippings or debris in storm drains can become a breeding ground for mosquitoes. They can hatch in just 48 hours! So, after it rains, make sure to check your neighborhood's storm drain and keep it clean by sweeping or raking up any debris.

Winter Parking

Effective October 1 of each year until April 15 of the following year, night parking rules are in effect. Please see www.casselton.com/policies-ordinances for more information.

Vacation Rate

If you will not be living in your home for 2 consecutive months or more, you may apply for vacation rate. These rates have changed and the resident will be billed for Sewer Surcharge, Mosquito and Ash Tree totaling \$26.86 per month. Any water usage will immediately remove the resident from vacation rate.

Water Restrictions

Effective April 15 to October 31 of every year, each resident with an even house number can water their lawn on even-numbered days. Odd house numbers on odd-numbered days. More information available at www.casselton.com/water-and-sewer.

Sump Pumps

Sump Pumps must be discharged to the outside storm drains between April 1 and October 31, not into the sanitary sewer inside the house. Let us know if you have questions. We're happy to help!

Fireworks

Firework displays are only allowed on July 3-5 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. and until midnight on the 4th. Any other date or time requires a permit approved by city council, so plan ahead. An application can be obtained from the city office for \$10.00.

2023 Annual Water Quality Report Now Available

The 2023 Annual Water Quality Report, also called the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) includes information about regulated contaminants in the drinking water, where the city water comes from, tips on how to conserve water, and how to protect your water.

In 2023, the City of Casselton detected 9 regulated contaminants in the drinking water. However, these contaminants were all at allowable levels and no health-based violations were reported. Three disinfectants and disinfection by-products were also monitored.

TREE TALK The Casselton Tree Board is focused on removing at risk Ash trees before the Emerald Ash Borer strikes! Diverse trees will be planted along Langer Avenue this spring.

Does your Elm tree look like it might have Dutch Elm Disease (DED)? To get your tree diagnosed, you may contact the City Forester at forester@casselton.org. If your Elm has DED, you must remove the tree as quickly as possible.

If you have an Ash tree or Elm tree on your boulevard, please fill out a cost share application form found at www.casselton.com/trees prior to removal of your tree. The City Forester must pre-approve the application for the cost share reimbursement to be paid.

CASSELTON CEMETERY POLICIES

Grave Decorations Guidelines:

Non-permanent decorations, such as potted plants and flags, may be removed without notice, however, they are allowed from Memorial Day until June 30th; failure to remove them may result in their removal without notification. Prohibited items include: candles, lights, hanging items, glass objects, plaques, memory stones, boxes, and other movable non-permanent items. No curbing, fencing, borders, bricks, or enclosures are allowed. Prior approval from the Cemetery Board or Manager is required for permanent decorations.

Cemetery Conduct Rules:

Dogs or other pets, golf carts, ATVs, snowmobiles, or similar leisure vehicles, picking flowers or altering trees and plants, peddling, soliciting, or placing advertisements are not allowed. Parking on cemetery roads is only permitted during services or grave visits. Park to allow the passage of other vehicles (half off the roadway). Improper use or display of the national flag, including weathered or tattered flags, is prohibited. Due to snow removal expense, the cemetery roads are not plowed during winter unless a winter burial is approved by the Cemetery Board.


